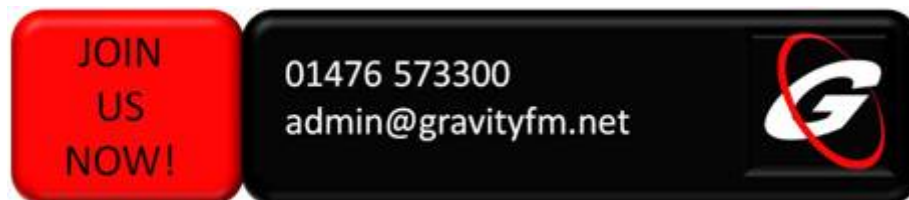


Get Involved

Protecting Children, Young People and Vulnerable Adults

Gravity FM is a community radio station and is committed to including volunteers from all sections of the community. Many posts within the organisation involve working with children, young people and vulnerable adults. As such, they are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and successful candidates will need to be CRB checked before being confirmed in post. If you are applying for a job supervising, caring for or otherwise connected with people from the following list, you must always declare any convictions for criminal offences, even where they have been spent. For these purposes, this includes working with children, older people, people who are dependent on alcohol or drugs and people with mental or physical disabilities, illness, injury or deformity, including those who are blind, deaf or without speech. Declaring a criminal conviction will not be taken into account unless relevant to the job.
